






Summer holiday learning packs

We want to tell you NOT to worry—we will take each day as it comes and there will be plenty of opportunities to revise knowledge that may feel like you no longer remember.


If you would like to test your brain over the summer holidays, ready for when you come back to school, you will find a *summer home learning* pack for your year group on the school website (under the home learning tab).
