# **Autumn Term 2 - Continued Progress and Improvement**

Dear Parents/Guardians,

And just like that, it is nearly Christmas. How did that happen?

As we descend into the midst of winter, there is so much to be thankful for and many accomplishments to be proud of. Your children and your school continue to grow, achieve and improve. As always, we appreciate your support.

Over the past month, two new members of staff have joined the St. Michael's team. Mr Campbell is our new site manager and Miss Bavington is our new office manager. Both have settled in brilliantly and have already made a huge contribution to life at St. Michael's. It feels like they have been with us for much longer than a matter of weeks!

The past month also saw our 2021 Ofsted report published, the key points of which are:

- Pupils enjoy attending this school. They are happy and feel safe.
- Staff provide high quality care rooted in the school's values of community, aspiration, learning and love.
- The new staff have quickly settled into the school and along with the existing staff, have made a great start to the school year.
- All staff want to give pupils the best possible education and have lofty ambitions for them.
- Pupils behave well in school and are keen to learn.
- School leaders have made significant changes to what children are taught and how they are taught. These changes are ambitious.

In terms of development points, Ofsted advised us to focus on the following areas:

- Ensure that the changes made to curriculum and teaching are fully embedded.
- Continue to develop staff so that they can share leadership responsibilities over time.
- For school leaders to prioritise specific areas of school life, rather than trying to do too much, too soon.
- To continue making progress and improvements to Reception.

November has also seen our girls football team reach heights never achieved by a St. Michael's football team (neither girls or boys), as they reached the semi-finals of the Aston Primary Schools' FA 5-a-side Championship. They did so by winning their league with an unbeaten record! The boys team also made history by picking up their first ever victory following weeks of hard work, determination and commitment.
